Journal.fi & ORCID (not part of the FP7 bid)

- Goals in Kotilava project:
 1. Better technical integration of ORCID in OJS
 2. Instructions for journals on how and why to use ORCIDs
- Results:
 1. Kotilava project has participated in the development of OJS ORCID integration (<https://pkp.sfu.ca/2016/05/09/pkp-sprint-2016-orcid-integration/>), which was published last year
 2. Using ORCIDs will be a part of a general metadata guideline prepared for Journal.fi journals
- Lessons learned:
 - Following the ORCID technical guidelines is important in integration: no handwritten ORCIDs or ORCIDs fetched with a search

Journal.fi & DOAJ (not part of the FP7 bid)

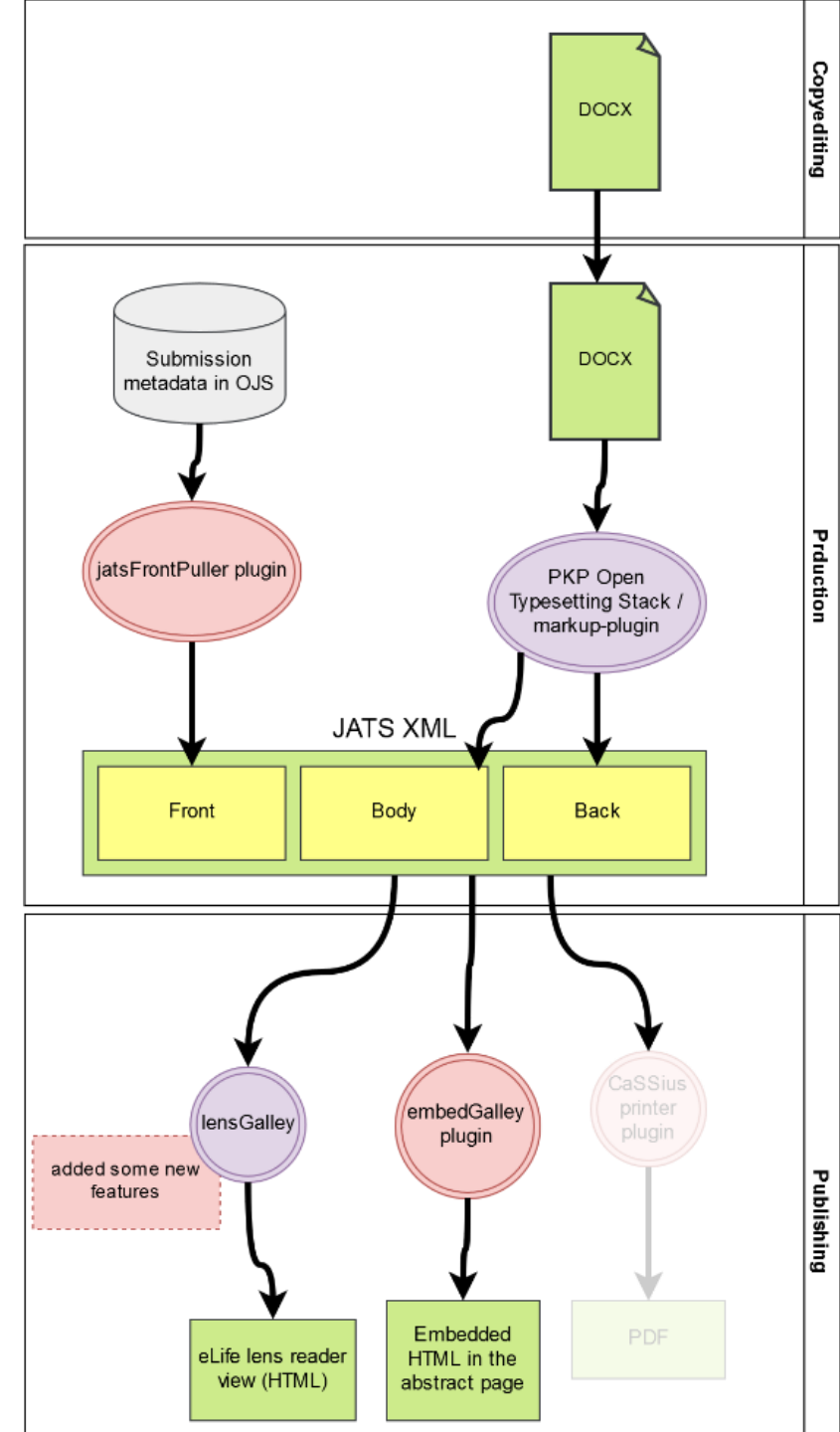
- Goals in Kotilava project:
 1. Better export function for article level metadata to DOAJ in OJS
 2. Instructions for journals on why and how to apply to DOAJ
- Results:
 1. Kotilava project has participated in the development of DOAJ API integration for OJS: <https://github.com/pkp/pkp-lib/issues/850>
 2. A general guideline for applying to DOAJ will be available for the Journal.fi journals
- Lesson learned: There still exists ignorance on and suspicions towards some DOAJ criteria (e.g. CC licenses) but a new funding model requires these criteria to be fulfilled so that they probably will be adopted until 2019

Journal.fi & funder information (FP7)

- Goals in our bid:
 - Collecting funder information in Journal.fi platform
- Results:
 - Workshop dealing with funder information (20 participants)
 - fundRef plugin for OJS3: integrates the CrossRef Funder Registry to OJS3 (<https://github.com/ajnyga/fundRef>)
- Lessons learned:
 - There are new plans from PKP to integrate the CrossRef Funder Registry and some other CrossRef services as well to OJS 3.2 (due December 1, 2017).
 - A deeper *core* integration in OJS is needed, which will take into account also the necessary changes to OAI-PMH and CrossRef export plugin

Journal.fi & JATS XML (FP7)

- Goals in our bid
 - Promoting the production of XML versions in the journals of Finnish learned societies
- Results
 - Two XML workshops for journals (*basics and hands on*): 20 / 6 participants
 - XML workflow for OJS3 users
 - One journal started to publish in XML (first one in Finland) <http://journal.fi/inf/issue/view/4433>
- Lessons learned:
 - XML publishing still requires special expertise



The Federation of Finnish Learned Societies

- An umbrella organisation for 271 societies and 4 academies
- Promotes awareness and usage of research results
- Provides services for Finnish learned societies
 - House of Sciences for the meetings and seminars of the societies
 - Publication services (printed publications): Bookstore Tiedekirja, Publication storage, Exchange centre of scientific literature
 - Publication services (electronic publications): Journal.fi (former Scientific Journals Online) – an OJS platform for OA journals
 - Training, Workshops
 - Administrating government subsidies for scholarly publications and conferences
- Societies are independent actors and they can choose the services they want to use
